Down the left side You'll note the title font reading "DAEDRIC ATLANTEAN" – these are the names of the two constructed languages on the right of the letters. Daedric – from Bethesda's Oblivion game, and Atlantean, for the Disney film Atlantis: The Lost Empire. Both have simple character mappings to English sounds (that can be found online), and are transcribed below:
