

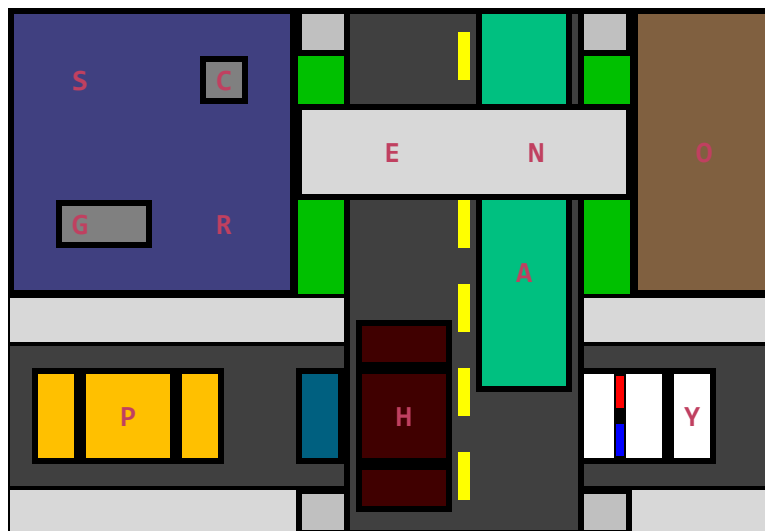
Solution to Set Construction

The pieces in the puzzle need to be cut out; it should become obvious that all cuts are made along the red lines and that pieces are folded along the thick black lines. Tabs on the side of the pieces indicate edges that need to be glued or taped to other edges. Once each piece has been cut and folded into a three-dimensional shape, they will need to be properly arranged.

The various letters and numbers printed on the pieces indicate how the pieces attach to one another. For instance, a B on one piece should attach directly to a B on another piece. The orientation of the letters on the pieces should also match up when the pieces are put together.

Not all of the letters have a match though. The flavor text indicates that the director wanted to “start the opening sequence with a dramatic overhead shot,” so once the model of the movie set is built, simply read off the letters that appear when viewed from above:
